It was more painful day after day because we had no food, drinking water and hardly any hope of a better tomorrow. Yet, my faith has saved me. My uncle changed our lives and he took his responsibility seriously and promised on behalf of his brother to always watch over us even though he also has a family. My mom is not getting along well and she has a very emaciated body. My sorrow is thinking about one day having to live without my mother and I live in fear of losing her as I lost my father. This anxiety makes it difficult for me to smile. I pray to the Lord all the days of my life so he can help me reach my goals in life. I want to be good in school so I can be financially independent one day!

My name is Andre Charles-Pierre and I was born in Fort Liberté, Haiti on February 9, 2001. I come from a large family of seven children. I have five brothers and one sister, we all live together at "Cite Noon" which is one of five districts of the town. I go to Baptist Phaeton School and I am in the 4th grade. I live in a family with financial problems and it is very difficult for my parents to feed seven children. At times it's very difficult for mom and dad to tell us, at the end of the day, that we have to go to bed without eating anything, and they feel very ashamed. I grew up in a protestant Christian family and my parents have done their best urging us to depend on God's love and prayer. Every Sunday, with money or not, with food or not, we attend church services. The Pastor always finds a way to comfort us and his words become our spiritual food. I love to go to beach and to play football as any other child of my age, and my dream is to become a pastor.

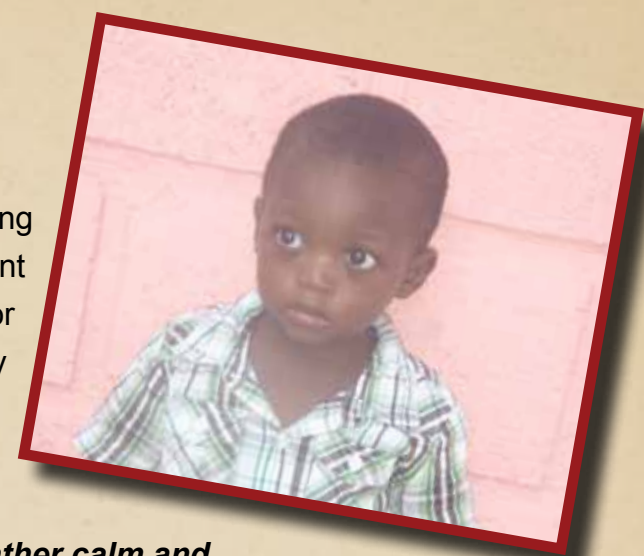

I never could understand the fact of being poor and having a large family, but that is the way it is. We live in the village of Williamson near Mercy & Sharing Village. I feel lucky to attend Mercy & Sharing Learning Academy that is totally free and also provides books, which allows me to have access to a great education. I need an education so I won't be poor when I grow up. I think a large family with meager means is not a good thing, because sometimes we are not able to eat.



My father is a farmer and my mother is a merchant, but my mom's business doesn't earn much money. We usually don't have enough money for supplies for her to sell. Our house is extremely small, with eight persons staying in a house with only two small rooms – it is quite difficult. We're just piling on top of each other and we often quarrel because of lack of space. But I'm trying to keep my mind positive saying to myself, "things could have been worse because me and my family have survived the earthquake which is not the case for some of my friends." With such thoughts I find joy of living and overflowing energy that allows me to pursue my goal of getting good grades in school. I am in the sixth grade and my favorite is math and I enjoy running and reading. I am very happy that my best friend lives next to my house and goes to the same school. Her name is Nerline Hiller. She is super nice we always have things to say and share, our secrets ... but I cannot tell you our secrets, otherwise they will not be secrets anymore. Thank you for reading my story.
